(2) Cairn:"Grand Opening Marker" at the July 14, 1932 dedication
(3) Peace Poles: Presented by the Japanese Government."May Peace Prevail"
(4) Historical Interpretive Center: Under construction. Restrooms open.
(5) Interpretive Centre \& Conservatory: thousand of succulents and cacti, restaurant, gift shop and horticulture library
(6) Sunken Garden Area: Fountain pool and landscaped with thousands of plants
(7) Carillon Bell Tower: A 1976 Bi-Centennial project of The ND Veterans' Organization
(8) 911 Memorial Site: Actual steel girders from New York City's former Twin Towers
(9) Peace Tower: The four concrete columns reach a majestic 120 feet/36.6 meters
